


# St Saviour's Church

**Mark 6 - Rejected  
and Despised by  
his Hometown**

The story of what happened to Jesus when he decided to return to his town is a familiar tale, one that happens to all of us: we may achieve wonderful things away from home where we are not well known. When we come back home we discover that people no longer see us in the same way or rather no longer recognise who we have become or how we have changed or grown. There is much wisdom to be found in this gospel passage: rejection, coping with change and identity, finding our spiritual home, or even journeying to the deepest truth of ourselves.

## SECOND READING

A reading from the 2nd letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

In view of the extraordinary nature of these revelations, to stop me from getting too proud I was given a thorn in the flesh, an angel of Satan to beat me and stop me from getting too proud! About this thing, I have pleaded with the Lord three times for it to leave me, but he has said, 'My grace is enough for you: my power is at its best in weakness.' So I shall be very happy to make my weaknesses my special boast so that the power of Christ may stay over me, and that is why I am quite content with my weaknesses, and with insults, hardships, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong.

## GOSPEL

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Mark.

He left that place and came to his home town, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a

few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
